Job Description: Congregational Life Facilitator (part time)

<u>Scope</u>: Working with the Pastor and the Elders, The Congregational Life Facilitator will coordinate ministry programs designed to meet the spiritual growth of our members of all ages. They will display a commitment to serving Jesus Christ through serving His people at Bethlehem Lutheran Church – Warrensburg, MO.

Responsibilities and Duties

Provide leadership, plan and implement age-appropriate activities for <u>Seniors, Adults, Ir, and High School and Elementary</u> age youth that promote spiritual growth and community through faith development, fellowship, and enjoyment of God's gifts. Such activities might include: weekly activities, small group Bible study, retreats and service projects.

Work with the Education, Mission, Evangelism, and Fellowship boards to help coordinate efforts among them, connect their activities, and encourage congregational and community participation in all of these areas.

Attend monthly Education Committee meetings.

Maintain regular communication with youth, parents, the pastor, church office and the surrounding community using appropriate technology and social media.

Assist the Sunday School superintendent in the recruitment and training of adult volunteers to serve as Sunday School teachers and youth group leaders.

Periodically meet with the various fellowship and volunteer groups at Bethlehem: Mary Martha, Men's club. Merry Widows. Singles. etc.

Focus on one to three of these Bethlehem groups where guidance and direction is most needed for cohesion and strength.

Meet with community groups that interface with Bethlehem (4H, Boys and Girls Scouts, etc.) at least once annually.

Assist with preparation of Vacation Bible School if the need arises.

Requirements: The candidate should have experience working with youth and children in a faith community setting. This position shall be an example of dynamic leadership for a team of volunteers who can relate to persons of all ages and support Sunday school and other spiritual formation activities. The person in this position shall work closely with the pastor to develop and execute a program that includes Christian education advancement for participants of all ages and maintains high visibility with educational and social groups within our congregation. The Torkelson Family Story: My Partner for a Miracle Pregnancy

The journey of delivering a baby into the world can be difficult enough, but the addition of embryo adoption and an unexpected surgery make pregnancy and delivery that much harder.

When the Torkelson Family moved for Ashley's job on Whiteman Air Force Base, they were ready to have a baby and knew they were embarking on a long journey, but they were determined to have their miracle.

Improbable, But Not Impossible

Ashley had always dreamed of having a baby and when the couple found out that there was no chance that they would ever have genetic kids she was devastated.

"It was soul crushing," Ashley said. "All I ever wanted to be was a mother. We immediately started looking for other options."

They turned to the obvious and most common choice, adoption but it quickly became clear that the odds of matching with a child wasn't in their favor.

"It was like hitting a brick wall; and it's so astronomically expensive!" Ashley said, but she wasn't ready to give up yet. "That's when we came across embryo adoption – and it was perfect."

Embryo adoption makes the dreams of having a baby possible. These embryos generally come from another family's in vitro fertilization (IVF) process, and allows parents to use donor embryos from another family to conceive a baby. Ashley and Ben were overjoyed at an opportunity that would allow Ashley to carry a child.

They couldn't have been happier with their experience. Recovery was smooth, and they felt like they were waited on hand and foot.

"All of the nurses were amazing. We would get a plan at the beginning of each night that would allow us to get the most sleep possible," Ashley said.

Everything was taken care of from pain management, to breastfeeding with the Lactation Consultant, Ruthie, to even the visits from maintenance and housekeeping to make sure everything was going smoothly.

"I love Wanda!" Ben said about the food and nutritional team. "She brought us food as we came in between lunch and dinner and she got us a snack pack and fruit. The team always checked in to make sure 'dad' was okay – and it made me feel included."

Both Ashley and Ben enjoyed their recovery at WMMC and loved that the entire team was kind, patient, knowledgeable

and helpful with this amazing experience.

Beginning the Miracle Journey

After a lot of research, testing, preparation, and several appointments at Western Missouri Women's Health Center with Ashley's doctor, Dr. Deborah Gregory, OB/GYN, the couple boarded a plane and headed to Spain to complete the IVF process. They explained that the cost for embryo adoption in Spain and two weeks of vacation was the same cost as IVF in the United States, and the vacation allowed Ashley to relax while waiting for good news.

After returning from Spain, Ashley and Ben received the good news that they were pregnant!

"You don't take the pregnancy for granted, because you can't just try again," Ashley said. "We would have to start the process all over again, and the IVF process is several thousand dollars."

This was Ashley's first-ever pregnancy so she wanted the best care possible. Dr. Gregory was the one who had ordered all of her preliminary testing for the infertility process, so it only seemed right that Ashley came back to her to finish this miracle journey she was on.

With guidance from Dr. Gregory and the midwives, and a lot of antacid for Ashley's heartburn, the Torkelsons walked into Western Missouri Medical Center's Labor and Delivery Unit and welcomed their baby into this world on June 21st, 2019.

The Unexpected Turn

After checking into the Labor & Delivery Unit, Ashley began to talk to the medical team about her plans, especially Tracey Arwood, Certified Nurse Midwife, who worked her through for most of her labor and delivery.

"I wanted a very natural birth without being induced or having an epidural," Ashley said, adamant about avoiding interventions at all costs.

Tracey respected Ashley's plan and they began to work through delivery together. However, it became very clear to Tracey, Ashley and Ben that a natural birth was not going to happen. Ashley ended up having the necessary interventions to insure the safety of the baby. When Ashley wasn't progressing through labor, Dr. Gregory decided a C-Section was necessary.

"But Tracey made me feel so in control of every decision," Ashley said. "She helped me go as long as I could with one intervention before moving on to the next one. She was very respectful of my process, and was amazing. I never felt pushed to do something I wasn't ready for."

A C-Section was the absolute last thing that Ashley wanted, but it wasn't an emergency situation so Dr. Gregory was able to take the time to explain to the Torkelsons what was happening in detail. She explained that she had a slow amniotic leak, which meant Ashley's body was inducing her before the baby was ready.

"She was so good about sitting Ashley down and saying a C-Section is happening, but still addressing her fears and

















concerns," Ben said. "Sometimes when you go to the doctor, your doctor tells you what they are doing and they don't explain why. Dr. Gregory wasn't like that. She addressed every single concern we had before going into surgery." So with that, the Torkelsons headed into surgery, ready to meet their baby boy.

Worth the Wait

At 6:51 pm on June 21st Ashley and Ben met their son, Corban Levi.

They couldn't have been happier with their experience. Recovery was smooth, and they felt like they were waited on hand and foot.

"All of the nurses were amazing. We would get a plan at the beginning of each night that would allow us to get the most sleep possible," Ashley said.

Everything was taken care of from pain management, to breastfeeding with the Lactation Consultant, Ruthie, to even the visits from maintenance and housekeeping to make sure everything was going smoothly.

Athletic Professionals Attend Second Annual Sports Medicine Seminar Hosted by WMMC and UCM

WARRENSBURG, MO (July 22, 2019) – Western Missouri Medical Center (WMMC) and University of Central Missouri (UCM) Nutrition and Kinesiology partnered up for the 2nd Annual Sports Medicine Seminar. This year's seminar focused on pediatrics and educating athletic professionals on some of the most pressing health concerns facing young athletes and how to address them.

David Glover, MD and UCM Team Physician, kicked the seminar off speaking about Apophyseal Injuries – or bony growths that are common in the pediatric population from overuse. Drew Glover, MD and UCM Team Physician, discussed the risks of Sport Specialization and how to avoid burnout. Other presentations included Dana Brewington, MD and UCM Team Physician, shared on concussions and when a child should return to play. Jessie Burgess, Dietician at WMMC spoke about pediatric nutrition and diet, as well as common eating disorders in younger athletes.

Board Certified Orthopedic Surgeon Aaron Rupp, DO, spoke about shoulder dislocations, the most commonly dislocation injury in athletes. He discussed how they occur and how to treat them.

Following WMMC's presentations, Coach Dave Slifer delivered the keynote speech on the UCM Jennies' journey to winning the National Championship. Attendees also heard from Dr. Greg Williams, about Functional Movement Screenings and how to conduct basic screenings to determine an athlete's potential for injury.

There was representation from over 15 organizations and school districts, including Boss Body Fitness Gym, Crest Ridge School District, Golden Valley Memorial Hospital, Knob Noster School District, Lee's Summit Medical Center, Leeton School District, Platinum Martial Arts, Santa Fe School District, Sedalia School District, Select PT, Show-Me Christian School, Stonehill College, Twister Sports, University of Central Missouri, Warrensburg School District, Western Missouri Medical Center, Southside Swarm, and XCA.

Dean's Story: Why WMMC's CFO Wears Pink



"This Is Why I Wear Pink." – Dean Omhart, WMMC CFO
Dean didn't know that walking into a post office in October of
2008 would result in him wearing pink every day in October for
the rest of his life, but that's exactly what happened. He saw a
woman dressed up in pink on October 1st for breast cancer
awareness and he asked if she wore pink just on October 1st.
"I wear pink all month," she said firmly. "And you could too."
Dean went home and thought about that for a while. Working
in healthcare, he saw the value and although he only had two
pink shirts, and thought he'd give a shot. A few laundry loads
later he made it through his first week of pink.

October went by and he collected a couple more pink shirts, and happy that he helped raise awareness for breast cancer he put his pink shirts away and moved on with his life. A few months down the road, he met his girlfriend Susan and wore pink to one of their dates. He explained to her why he had a pink shirt, and his story of wearing pink through October. October 1st, 2009 came around and he rolled out of bed, tired eyed and unsure what the day would hold for him. To his surprise, he opened his closet to see a gift from his girlfriend, Susan - a row of brand new pink shirts. Accepting this new trend in his life, Dean has worn pink every day in October since, and thanks to Susan, he does much less laundry.

Wearing Pink for Leslie

In December 2009, however Dean's hobby for raising breast cancer awareness became much more serious. Leslie – his "girlfriend" from 3rd grade, and more so, his life-long friend – called him up to give him a chat. Before hanging up the phone, she said "By the way, I have been diagnosed with breast cancer."

Dean was in shock, but after talking to her and understanding she'd done everything for early detection, she was going through treatments and was as fine as a woman can possibly be after being diagnosed with breast cancer.

Through treatment, chemotherapy, and prayers, Leslie made it through breast cancer and Dean became an even bigger advocate for breast cancer awareness, preventative screenings, and mammograms.

Wearing Pink for Karen

Dean continued to raise breast cancer awareness, but nothing would prepare him for August 2014, when he would get a call that Karen, his ex-wife, had been diagnosed with breast cancer and wanted to speak to him immediately. She had been hospitalized and Dean quickly dropped everything he was doing for the four-hour drive to Salina, KS to see her at her bedside

Listening to Karen's story, it wasn't looking good. She admitted that at some point she was aware of the breast cancer, but she never had a preventative screening or a mammogram, and now it was progressing to the point of no return. She was struggling to keep awareness of the conversation, and Dean struggled to keep coherent communication with her going. A few trips happened back and forth of Dean visiting her on his weekends off, and Karen received some chemotherapy, but the cancer was clearly taking over her body and her condition was quickly worsening.

A few weeks after being diagnosed, Dean got the call that he needed to get to her – and fast. Dean drove the four hours to her, unsure if he would make it or not. He dashed out of the car and into the hospital, running to her bedside. Bursting into the hospital room, he found her gasping, with Karen's family sitting at her feet. Understanding what was happening, he hurried to her bedside, and was able to whisper his dying message to her. Moments later, she passed, and Dean was left with her grieving family.

Early Detection is Why I Wear Pink

"This is why I wear pink," Dean says. "I have had two people very dear to me get diagnosed with breast cancer, and this is the two paths that breast cancer can take. I always encourage people to get their preventative screenings."

Leslie and Karen aren't the only two people that Dean has known to have breast cancer. Two years ago his little sister had breast cancer, and due to a preventative screening was able to catch it in time and is doing great.

Dean's collection of pink has grown from a hand full of shirts to a full wardrobe, suit and tie, and even a pink mustang convertible. All in the name of raising breast cancer awareness and getting people to get their preventative screenings.

Johnson County Board of Services Director Melissa Frey will represent that partnering organization. Their program should begin around 6:30 pm, and the public is welcomed to attend.

2019 Street Maintenance Overlay Project

The Warrensburg Street Department would like to advise residents and visitors of the community that the 2019 Street Maintenance Resurfacing Program will begin Wednesday morning July 24, 2019, weather permitting. Roto-milling (removing old surface) of affected city streets is to begin first, Wednesday morning July 24, 2019, weather permitting. Hot Mix Overlay (installing new surface) of affected city streets is to begin Thursday morning July 25, 2019. The entire Resurfacing Program should be completed by the end of the day Wednesday, July 31, 2019, weather permitting.

Residents and businesses are being asked not to park vehicles on the affected streets Tuesday through Thursday, July 23rd through August 1st, 2019 or until after the resurfacing process is completed. No Parking signs will be posted by the Street Department, and vehicles may be towed at the owner's expense. No Parking signs will be removed as soon as streets are complete and ready to be opened to traffic. The streets scheduled for resurfacing will begin with East Clark Street & South Holden Street, and continue in no particular order as follows: East Clark St: South Holden Street east to South Maguire Street/ Business 13.

South Holden Street: South Street south to Hale Lake Road. Ridge Drive: Broad Street/Montserrat Park Road to North End. The East Side of loop only.

West Market Street: North Main Street east to North Warren Street. South Country View Lane: DD Highway south to Cul-de-sac. North Holden Street: Young Street/ Business 50 north to 50 Highway Bridge. East Russell Avenue: PCA Road west to Burkarth Road. Polk Street: North Holden Street west to North Washington Street.

PLEASE DO NOT WATER YOUR LAWN UNTIL THE RESURFACING WORK IS COMPLETED.

Tip: Are you and your team building strategic networks?



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


