Calling all youth!!!!! Each year, the Optimist International Foundation promotes both an essay and oratorical contest. Our club hosts the local Oratorical contest every year here in Warrensburg. The contest wil held March 26 at 6:30 p.m. at a location to be determined soon. This is a great opportunity to earn scholarship SSSS as st will be well as gain speaking experience.

Since its start in 1928, the Optimist Oratorical Contest has become the longest-running program sponsored by Optimist International. This year's oratorical ' topic Just iMagine a World without Boundaries? is a theme with a very broad spectrum of interpretation. The contest is designed for youth to gain experience in public speaking and provide them with the opportunity to compete for a college scholarship. It is very easy to apply for the contest. Interested students should prepare a 4- to 5-minute speech on the assigned topic to present at the contest. The speeches are judged at the Club level, Regional level (if needed) and then at the District level. Our first and second place winners will go directly to Regionals' to compete for a \$500 award. District winners get scholarships of \$2500, \$1500 and \$1000.

Long-term owners of Missouri farms are proud of their family accomplishments. This was evident during the Centennial Farm program held in Missouri during the American Revolution Bicentennial Year of 1976. In that popular program, 2,850 Missouri farm owners in 105 of Missouri's 114 counties were recognized as owning a "Center nnial Farm.

Interest in the program continued after 1976. Several Missouri farm owners asked about having their farms recognized, so the University of Missouri College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources and University of Missouri Extension planned a 10-year update in 1986 called the "Century Farm" program. During this update, 1,080 additional Missouri farms were recognized.

Long-term family farm owners who were not able to take part in the 1976 or 1986 events still wanted recognition, so the College and MU Extension planned for annual updates. Missouri Farm Bureau joined as a program co-sponsor in 2008. This program has been sustained as a yearly event with over 100 farms recognized each year

Guidelines

Guidelines used in the selection and recognition of Missouri Century Farms:

- 1. The same family must have owned the farm for 100 consecutive years or more as of Dec. 31, 2020.
- 2. The line of ownership from the original settler or buyer may be through children, grandchildren, siblings, or nephews or nieces, including through marriage or adoption
- 3. The present farm shall consist of no less than 40 acres of the original land and shall make a financial contribution to the overall farm income

Sponsorship

MU Extension, the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, and the Missouri Farm Bureau jointly sponsor the Missouri Century Farms program. Local MU Extension Councils help with sponsorship by publicizing the program, collecting and certifying nominations, and arranging for local recognition. The Extension Web Services team rdinates the program.

Applications

Applications are available starting February 1 each year from the MU Extension office in your county or from Univerof Missouri-Century Farms, 506 Hitt St., Whitten Hall, Room 4, Columbia, MO 65211. They must be turned in by May 1.

A fee of \$100 is required to cover processing costs, one certificate, a booklet and one two-sided metal sign (includes MU and Missouri Farm Bureau logos) for each approved farm.

Send a completed application, order form and a check made payable to University of Missouri–Century Farms for the total amount on your order form. Return completed applications to University of Missouri–Century Farms, 506 Hitt St., Whitten Hall, Room 4, Columbia, MO 65211, or to the MU Extension office in the county where your farm is located. For more information, call toll-free 1-800-292-0969 or email <u>extpubs@missouri.edu</u>.

Applications must be postmarked by May 1, 2020. Late applications cannot be accepted.

Optional attachments

Feel free to attach an account of any special events held on the farm, unusual happenings, significant improv identifying landmarks, farm usage over the years, interesting information regarding the founder and any subsequent owner(s), and copies of pictures of special interest (include a short description). **Do not send any original or otherwise** valuable documents as we cannot return them. These materials will be passed on to your local MU Extension office. They may use these materials at your recognition or pass them along to your county historical society



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



Amy and Kyle's Story: Our Partner for A Surrogate Pregnancy



Amy and Kyle had been dreaming about being parents and wanted start a family of their own in South Lake Tahoe, California. However, when Amy was diagnosed with Stage 1 Breast Cancer and part of her treatment included being placed on a ten-year hormone therapy treatment plan pregnancy wasn't an option for her.

Devastated her and her spouse, Kyle, began searching for answers. This is their story of how Western Missouri Medical Center (WMMC) was a part of helping them achieve their dream of having a baby.

The "Wright" Person

Looking for any avenue that would allow Kyle and Amy to have a family, they came to the answer of surrogacy and started working to find the right match. After years of waiting anxiously, they were connected with Paige Wright who had all the right qualities they were looking for. Paige had a positive and beautiful personality, understood motherhood through her own three children, and the best part was that Paige was an Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) at Western Missouri Women's Health Center.

They soon met Paige and decided she was a perfect match. She said she was inspired to become a surrogate from all the people she had met during her time as an LPN that wanted to have children but couldn't.

"She realized how difficult it was for some couples to achieve parenthood and understood that we wanted to have the joy of having a child; and the fact that she wanted to help us achieve this dream of ours was incredible," Kyle stated. "We were so grateful that someone had it in their heart to be willing to go through all that to let a couple like us be able to have a child that we really have been dreaming of." Excited but anxious, Kyle, Amy and Paige started their surrogate journey together to bring baby Piper into the world.

Across Country Pregnancy

Starting this journey Amy and Kyle were apprehensive of being 1,700 miles away from their conceived child. In addition to the standard pregnancy appointments, a surrogate pregnancy is considered high risk and require extra attention. While Paige was happy to let Amy and Kyle be a part of every step of the journey, they were only able to come and visit Paige a few times during her pregnancy. They decided

they could fly in to visit Paige once every three months for an ultrasound to see their baby's development.

"It's difficult having someone across the country that you would like to see all the time but Paige communicated on a daily basis. She would send updates and pictures and even do video conferences at appointments," Amy said.

The pregnancy wasn't easy for either the future parents or for Paige but they would soon have the ending they had been dreaming of.

Delivery Day

Since Paige's pregnancy was high risk, Paige was induced at 39 weeks to avoid any unnecessary complications. Not wanting to miss the birth of their child they had been waiting so long for, they made the decision to fly in a few days before Paige was supposed to be induced.

"We so excited, but we were so stressed," Kyle said. "We were finally at the day that we had been dreaming of for years."

Paige went into labor, and from the moment that Amy and Kyle arrived they felt like family. Dr. Gregory communicated to them how Paige was induced and why they were trying to keep the delivery as natural as possible and the nurses did everything they could to make sure that Kyle and Amy felt like they were a part of the process.

"There is a lot of physical and emotional stress that goes into the surrogacy process but the moment when we saw Piper for the first time it was all worth it," Amy said. "Once our baby was born they made us feel like we were the ones that had the baby. I immediately got to hold Piper and do skin-to-skin with her."

While Paige was recovering and delivering in one room, Amy and Kyle were able to be in the room next to her while Piper was being monitored. Delivery went as smooth as possible and Paige recovered while Amy and Kyle were overjoyed with their new family member.



Amy and Kyle's Message to Other Couples: WMMC Feels Like Family

Amy and Kyle quickly agreed on two things – the WMMC team made them feel like parents and they definitely didn't want to leave. "We are so grateful that everyone at WMMC made us feel like family and like we were Piper's parents from the moment she was born," Amy said. "The staff was able to give us that experience and it's probably the only time in our lifetime that we will get to have that experience."

Stockton, Mo.-"Hay production is important to the Southwest Missouri forage and livestock industry," says Regional MU Extension Livestock Field Specialist Patrick Davis. Whether selling or feeding hay to your livestock, harvesting and baling hay properly at the right time is important for a high quality product. A high quality product will lead to better hay demand or less cattle supplementation during hay feeding.

"Soil fertility and nutrients are impacted by hay production," say Davis. Understanding this impact is important to make sure soil nutrients removed during the hay making process are replenished for optimum hay production in the future.

"Understanding the economics of hay production, as well as cattle nutrition and hay feeding, is important to farm operation profit potential," say Davis. Proper economics of hay production, making sure cattle nutrient needs are met, and limiting wastage during the hay making and feeding process will help to improve farm operation profit potential.

To fulfill education needs mentioned above, MU Extension is collaborating with Heartland Tractor, Heritage Tractor,



Feldman Crop Insurance Agency, and Four State Ag to provide a three-night regional hay school discussing hay production and how to capture the value of your investment. The school will begin at 6 PM on the evenings of March 17th, 23rd and 24th at the Vernon County Fairgrounds Centennial Building in Nevada, Mo. MU Extension Agriculture Specialists will provide the education. Topics will include:

Mercado said UCM was initially accredited in business by AACSB in 1995. Its accounting program was accredited in 1999. --more--

According to AACSB, 862 institutions across 56 countries and territories are accredited by the association. Some 189 institutions have earned supplemental AACSB accreditation for their accounting programs.

"AACSB congratulates each institution on their achievement," said Stephanie M. Bryant, AACSB's executive vice president and chief accreditation officer. "Every AACSB-accredited school has demonstrated a focus on excellence in all areas, including teaching, research, curricula development, and student learning. The intense peer-review process exemplifies their commitment to quality business education."

To achieve accreditation, a college or university must undergo a rigorous internal focus process, engage with an AACSBassigned mentor, and undergo a peer-reviewed evaluation. This is a multi-year process, requiring schools to demonstrate a focus on development and implementation of a plan that aligns with AACSB standards. This requires excellence in areas that relate to strategic management and innovation. It also encompasses, student, faculty, and staff as active participants; learning and teaching; and academic and professional engagement.

A school has to achieve AACSB business accreditation before it can earn accounting accreditation. After doing so, the institution must develop and implement a mission-driven plan to satisfy business accreditation quality standards, and satisfy a supplemental set of standards specific to five-year continuous peer review to maintain high-quality and extend its accreditation.

"The SBA is committed to supporting women veterans with the training and resources they need to start, grow, or expand a small business."

Eligible organizations should submit applications for the Women Veteran Entrepreneurship Training Program funding opportunity (WVETP -2020-01) through <u>Grants.gov</u>. Applications not submitted via Grants.gov will not be evaluated. **The submission deadline is**



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
