ENFORCEMENT OF SNOW/ICE REMOVAL FROM CITY SIDEWALKS

Property owners in Warrensburg are advised the City is stepping up enforcement of a City ordinance that requires snow and ice to be removed from public sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of a snow/ice event. The City will be enforcing the ordinance in certain commercial areas and residential areas around schools. In prior snow events, patrons and students have been forced to walk in the street when sidewalks have not been cleared. This is a safety concern for pedestrians and drivers.

The ordinance requiring sidewalks to be cleared of snow and ice is not a new ordinance. Section 20-2 of the Code of City Ordinances was adopted in 1970 and states "It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of any property or the agent of any non-resident property owner within the city limits to permit any snow, ice or other obstruction to remain upon any sidewalk in front of or along such property so as to interfere with the free, easy or safe passage of people along and over such sidewalk".

The law is in effect for all properties in Warrensburg. The increased enforcement will be by patrol along streets shaded in green on the attached map and on a complaint basis for the remainder of the City. This map is also available on the City's website at www.warrensburg-mo.gov.

If a property owner or occupant is found to be in violation after 24 hours, a ticket will be issued.

Kennedy Center Theater Festival Honors Mollenkamp with Region 5 Gold Medal

WARRENSBURG, MO (Jan. 31, 2020) – As a professor of theatre, scholar, and artist, Julie Rae Mollenkamp's commitment to excellence at the University of Central Missouri is well known by her students, colleagues and patrons of the arts at UCM. What she does for the theatre profession at home and on a broader scale was recently recognized as the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival (KCACTF) honored her with its most prestigious award.

Mollenkamp was recognized through the presentation of the Kennedy Center Gold Medal at the KCACTF Region 5 Festival 52, Jan. 19-25 in Sioux Falls, S.D. The event was hosted by South Dakota State University and The University of South Dakota. Nominations from faculty and students contributed to the award selection, which was made within each of eight KCACTF regions.

In addition to recognizing extraordinary work in educational theatre teaching and production, the KCACTF Gold Medal honors an individual who has dedicated their time, artistry and enthusiasm to the development of KCACTF, and has made a strong commitment to the organization's goals and values. Mollenkamp vast experiences and contributions to her craft that have advanced the theatre education profession contributed to her selection.

The longtime professor said she was thankful to KCACTF for "this humbling recognition." She added, "I am a better wife, mother, teacher, artist and human being because of the opportunity to serve in this organization for the last 25 years - it has been the greatest gift of my career. I am truly grateful for the honor of helping our students grow into their best selves."

According to the KCACTF, Mollenkamp's extensive career includes work in directing and acting in more than 90 different projects. She is actively involved in the Speech and Theatre Association of Missouri, and is a past member of its Board of Governors. Her service with KCACTF and past productions have led to 56 Meritorious Achievement Awards, two invitations to the Region V Festival and eight National Accommodations, including the Citizen Artist Award. She also has been involved with the National Communication Association (NCA) Theatre Division, serving as chair from 1999-2001, and the Association for Theatre in Higher Education, where she served from 2006-2008 as vice president for membership and marketing.

Mollenkamp has served as National Playwriting Program Chair for KCACTF Region 5, and currently serves on the National Kennedy Center American College Theatre Committee as Region 5 member-at-large and as Representation, Equity, and Diversity Coordinator. She also is a member of the Dramatist Guild, the Society for Stage Directors and Choreographers and Statera Arts, an organization committed to bringing women into full and equal participation in the arts.

Throughout her distinguished professional career, Mollenkamp has received many accolades as a teacher, director, playwright and scholar. This includes recognition by UCM's College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences as a 2005 recipient of the Faculty Achievement Award, followed in 2006 by the CA-HSS Excellence in Teaching Award. In 2013 she received the

Speech and Theatre Association of Missouri Wayne Brown Award for Outstanding Teacher, and during the same year, she was appointed as the Meridith Harmon Sauer Distinguished Professor of Theatre at UCM. This is the most prestigious honor given to a UCM Theatre and Dance faculty member. Her many accolades also include the NCA Division of Theatre's Excellence in Teaching and Service Award and Lifetime Achievement Award, and the KCACTF Road Warrior Award.

Among Mollenkamp's vast projects, she premiered her one-woman performance of "In Conclusive Woman" at the Ryan Repertory Theatre in New York in 2009, a work that was published in "Best American Short Plays," 2006-2007. It also was included in the Rutgers' 30 year Feminist Artists Archives, and selected for publication in Applause Books' "Best American Monologues." Her performance work, "Another Woman's Baby," premiered at the University of Missouri and was performed at Ryan Repertory Theatre in July 2019. She has acted in and directed numerous plays that have been shared with a UCM audience in the James L. Highlander Theatre, among the achievements was her leading role performance as Violet Weston in the Pulitzer Prize-winning play, "August: Osage County."

The parents of two sons, Mollenkamp and her husband, Daniel, are the owners of Smashing Frame Productions, a film and theatre production company.

What a shocking number of professionals overlook!

Buried in your alumni network are some of those strategic connections you are looking for. They are likely doing something interesting, perhaps in an up-and-coming field and they've probably moved up the career ladder--as have you! Do you know what most (or some) of them are doing?

Author and marketing strategist Dorie Clarke's article, [3 Ways to Make the Most of Your Alumni Network](#) says, "there's a basic step a shocking number of professionals overlook: **provide an annual update to your alumni magazine's class notes column.**"

Her second way "to leverage your alumni network is to **volunteer for a role** that gives you an excuse to be in touch with other classmates."

Thirdly, "to tap alumni connections is to **share your professional expertise.** Alumni offices will frequently host professional development webinars; you could volunteer to lead one, exposing hundreds or even thousands of fellow graduates to your expertise (even those who don't attend will receive promotional messages featuring your name and bio)."

If reconnecting with you alumni sounds like a good idea, we suggest reading [this excellent article by Dorie Clarke](#)—she makes the case!



Tip: High-centrality and your strategic network.

Strategic networks are challenging, this is an idea that works

One goal of our 2020 tips is helping readers build their strategic networks. We all know networks are important for career success but many people aren't focusing on the most important—their strategic network.

Herminia Ibarra, Professor of Organizational Behavior at London Business School [describes the challenge](#) of building a strategic network this way: "It requires both time and attention outside routine, operational demands and investment in activities that can give you foresight on important trends in your industry and inform your choices about what you might be doing."

While it takes valuable time and requires reaching outside your immediate work group--often to more senior people--the benefits are huge. You raise your profile as the "support or resources that you are able to secure from outside your immediate group or firm affects your influence and reputation within it."

While looking at ideas for you to build your strategic network we returned to [recent research](#) on inner circle networks. "For both men and women...landing highly ranked leadership positions was correlated with having 'high centrality' in their peer network, meaning they are connected to other well-connected peers across their social network."

Bottom line: Look for well-connected peers and become better networked yourself.

Latest iOS Update Brings Several Important Bug Fixes

Not long ago, security researcher Brian Krebs discovered an issue with the iPhone 11. It contains a chip dubbed U1, which functions on UWB (Ultra Wide Band). Due to international regulatory requirements, the U1 chip has to disable itself at certain locations, which means that the phone has to periodically check for a user's location, even if you have that functionality turned off on your phone.

Recently, Apple released iOS 13.3.1, which contains a number of bug fixes. They include a fix that allows you to disable the periodic location checks being performed by the U1 Chip.

Apple has stated that they don't do anything more with the location data than verify that you're not in an area where the U1 chip has to be disabled. However, giant tech companies have made such claims before. Too often, it has come out later that the supposedly responsible company wound up selling or otherwise misusing the data in question, so it's hardly a surprise that Apple has received backlash about this.

Given Apple's history of responsiveness, it's also not much of a surprise that they moved quickly to assuage the fears of their legions of users.

As of the latest update, if you don't want your phone to be performing those location checks, just go to Settings - Privacy - Location Services - And System Services.

There, you'll find a toggle switch labeled Networking & Wireless with the location services symbol next to it. Toggle the switch off and that icon disappears. That's all there is to it.

Of course, iOS 13.3.1 contains many more fixes than just that, so be sure to check out Apple's release notes so you can properly prioritize installing the latest update. Kudos to Apple for their rapid response on the location services issue.



Why pay for PC repairs instead of doing it yourself?

1. Cheapness: If you accidentally break a fragile part, misdiagnose your computer's issue, overlook a detail you couldn't have known about, or misinterpret a poorly worded repair direction, that's the difference between maybe a \$70 repair job and needing to buy a new computer. People can accidentally void their warranties this way too. We've made and learned from these mistakes so you don't have to.

2. Safety: Certain computers are designed in an unethical manner to discourage amateur repairs, such as having exposed power supplies that can shock or in extreme cases kill the repairer. Another safety issue is cutting or piercing oneself on odd parts and tools.

3. Convenience: It's easier to just have someone qualified take care of the issue in a fast reliable manner. It's also a more convenient risk because if the repairers cause a complication instead of you, they are in most cases responsible for making it right.

If you want to learn to do PC repairs, it takes time, money and risk because nobody is perfect. Learning PC repairs is a great opportunity to improve your knowledge and make things easier on yourself here and there with computers. But, it's a far safer bet to use a repair place.

Data Privacy Tip #6



Beware of public Wi-Fi. Most home Wi-Fi connections are encrypted. Some public Wi-Fi connections are not. This means you're at risk of people monitoring your online activity. Sometimes, malware from someone else's device can infect your device. Ensure you've turned on your firewall, and have up-to-date malware protection, or you could run into problems. Delete data that you no longer use.

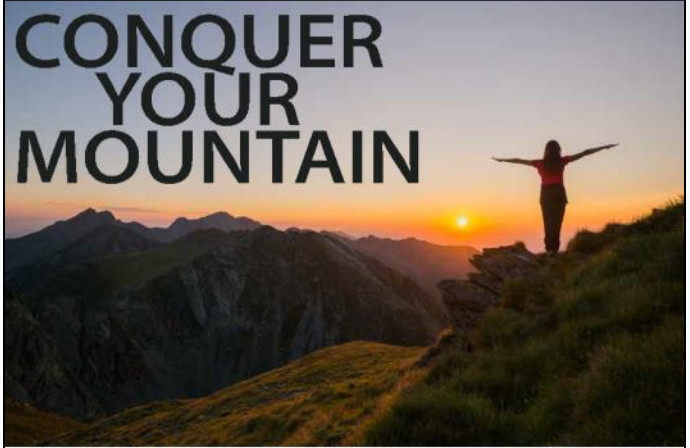

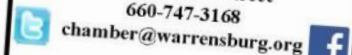
