

The U.S. Census Bureau is the federal government's largest statistical agency. We are dedicated to providing current facts and figures about America's people, places, and economy. Federal law protects the confidentiality of all individual responses the Census Bureau collects.

The U.S. Constitution requires that each decade we take a count or a census—of America's population.



The census provides vital information for you and your community.

- It determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress and is used to redraw district boundaries. Redistricting counts are sent to the states by March 31, 2021.
- Communities rely on census statistics to plan for a variety of resident needs including new roads, schools, and emergency services.
- Businesses use census data to determine where to open places to shop.

Each year, the federal government distributes more than \$675 billion to states and communities based on Census Bureau data.

In 2020, we will implement new technology to make it easier than ever to respond to the census. For the first time, you will be able to respond online, by phone, as well as by mail. We will use data that the public has already provided to reduce followup visits. And, we are building an accurate address list and automating our field operations—all while keeping your information confidential and safe.

MU Extension Offers Grand-Parenting and Kinship Care Class!

Harrisonville, Mo. - The University of Missouri Extension in Cass County is offering an 8 session "Parenting the Second Time Around (PASTA)" webinar series beginning April 20, 2020 online via zoom.

Raising your grandchildren or children other than your own? This class is for you. PASTA is a parenting program designed for relative caregivers who are not the biological parents of the children in their care. PASTA provides grandparents and other kinship caregivers with information, skills, and resources designed to enhance their ability to provide effective care for the young relatives they are parenting. PASTA includes topics such as child development, discipline and guidance, caring for oneself as a caregiver, rebuilding a family, living with teens, legal issues, and advocacy. Continuing education hours available for foster families.

Participants will register and pay the \$40.00 fee for the class in return they will be emailed a password protected link and handouts every Monday from April 20, 2020 through June 8, 2020 of a pre-recorded session of the workshop from the instructor. MU Extension Offers New Educational Program! Boost Your Brain & Memory: Brain **Fitness Class Online**

Harrisonville, Mo. - The University of Missouri Extension is offering an 8 session "Boost Your Brain & Memory: Brain Fitness Class" beginning April 13th online via an application called zoom.

Just as you can control and improve your general physical health with good habits so, too, can you improve the health of your brain-boosting your memory and mental agility, as well as reducing your risk of developing Alzheimer's disease or other causes of dementia.

According to Impact of the Education Boost Your Brain and Memory Program Among Senior Living Residents (The International Journal of Aging and Human Development, 2017) "Older adult participants completed measures of brain health knowledge, use of memory techniques, physical and intellectual activity and mindfulness at baseline and after the intervention group's completion of the course." This class uses a wholeperson approach that helps participants form new habits to live a healthier lifestyle, remember things better, be more organized, pay closer attention and regulate their emotions. Each participant will receive a workbook including memory exercises, tips on nutrition and exercise, and summaries of evidencebased research on brain health.

Classes will be held live on Mondays and Fridays from 6:00-7:00 pm. There is a \$40 per person cost associated with the program. There is no additional fee to use zoom you just need a computer or smart phone with internet or data. Participants will be emailed a workbook and the link to participate each week from the MU Extension Office.

UCM Students Producing Ear Guards to Bring Comfort to Healthcare Professionals, Others Who Wear Protective Gear

WARRENSBURG, MO (April 7, 2020) – Inspired by action taken by a Canadian youth, two University of Central Missouri students have found an innovative way to provide relief for individuals who experience discomfort from extended use of protective masks. The masks are worn by healthcare professionals on the frontlines of the nation's battle with COVID -19 and are essential for their protection, but the design of these protective items creates a problem that is recently getting a lot of attention. Many individuals who wear this protective gear for long periods of time experience pain caused by rubber straps that dig into the skin behind their ears.

On Monday, April 6, Matthew Argotsinger, Peculiar, Missouri, and Cameron Rogers, Camdenton, Missouri, began production of a new ear guard they plan to contribute initially to Western Missouri Medical Center. Through their volunteer efforts, they hope to serve nearly 600 employees with their new device, 400 of whom are on the frontline serving patients.

Argotsinger and Rogers are both UCM juniors majoring in Design and Drafting Technology. They have leadership positions in the American Institute of Building Design (AIBD) and the Design and Drafting Technology Student Association (DDSA), with Argotsinger serving as president and Rogers, vice president. Both students have been working closely with their instructor, Paul Brown, who is currently teaching the Advanced Parametric Modeling course and 3D Printing.

Dr. Roya Azimzadeh, program coordinator for Design and Drafting Technology, said she was contacted by Argotsinger, who shared with CADD faculty members his thoughts about how the program could make a positive contribution to fighting the current pandemic situation.

"I immediately welcomed the idea and suggested getting started right away," Azimzadeh said. Students began working in the CADD Design and Drafting Technology area of the Grinstead Building, where they have access to three 3D printers which they used to create a prototype, and continued to produce the first batch of their new device.

y can continue to pursue their academic dreams. "In moments such as these, it is common for each of us to consider the impact on those around I UCM President Roger Best. "Our students, the majoritom work to help pay for their education, have seen draterruptions in their ability to make ends meet. We are Argotsinger said he got the idea after reading about a Canadian boy, Quinn Callander, who used a design he found on the internet to create an ear guard that rests on the back of the head of the individual wearing the mask, and allows the rubber straps to attach to it, rather than wrap around their ears. His story went viral after his mother shared it on social media.

"I saw it on Facebook," Argotsinger said. "He uploaded the design so that anyone could get access to it and continue on their own. I saw other types of designs, but when I saw this one, I knew this is something we can work with."

Argotsinger said one of the issues he and Rogers discovered while working with the 3D printers is that production is a slow process. The students hope to produce up to 60 ear



guards a day to meet local needs as soon as possible. Currently, they are donating their time and the academic program is covering the cost of the production materials to make the ear guards possible. For students involved, however, there is much more in return for their efforts through lessons gained that don't always happen in a traditional classroom setting.

"Just reacting fast and appropriately to a situation and using what we have to help the cause" is a great learning experience, according to Rogers.

Argotsinger echoed that sentiment, adding that "Being able to adapt to a situation that keeps evolving and then also manipulating a certain design to make it work successfully, effectively and as efficiently as possible" will help make him better prepared for the professional world.

Brown agreed, noting, "This is a real-world experience for them using a customer that has a demand. They are trying to satisfy that demand through increasing production and productivity. It's a real good lesson in satisfying a customer."

While the educational benefits are valuable, all involved are pleased that they are making a contribution to help those who are on the front line in slowing the spread of COVID -19 and caring for those who are most affected.

TIP: Flip the message to the top.

Aaron Orendorff in "Your Colleagues Don't Read Anything You Write. Here Are 8 Ways to Change That" (New York Times) gives 8 ways that people will want to read your messages and here's one that's very easy.

People often bury the most important information at the bottom of the message (as the writer builds up steam, makes their argument, provides data). Instead, why not draft your email or message then look at the last sentence or paragraph and consider moving it to the top.

"Rather than building to the request — and risk muddling the meaning — this inversion forces us to lead with the need. After that, you'll often find much of the rest can be removed." - Aaron Orendorff

Trust your Gut

If something does not look safe, sound safe or feel safe - report

Making a Report is Asking for Help and Services

When you report, you are asking for a professional to help a child and their family. You do not need proof. You are not making an accusation.

You May Be the Only Person to Act

If you reasonably suspect a child is unsafe - report. Anonymous reports are accepted from anyone. Anyone making a report in good faith is protected against civil/criminal penalty or adverse employment action. Your identity is held confidential and will not be revealed.
