

Mandatory Face Coverings Effective July 6 for Johnson County

WARRENSBURG, Mo. (July 1, 2020) – Johnson County has had a recent surge in confirmed positive COVID-19 cases. This has prompted Johnson County Community Health Services (JCCHS) to implement a face covering mandate. This order goes into effect beginning at midnight on Monday, July 6, 2020.

The countywide order will continue for 21 days, expiring midnight on Tuesday, July 28. This timeline can be rescinded or extended as necessary.

The order requires individuals to wear a face covering in any indoor public location including but not limited to retail stores, grocery stores, offices, places of worship and restaurants/bars. Businesses can supply face coverings if they have the ability to provide them, but can require individuals to bring their own.

In addition, face coverings are required in outdoor public gathering places when social distancing is not an option.

As of June 30, 2020, Johnson County experienced a 32.8 percent increase of confirmed cases over a ten day period.

"The health, safety and wellness for our communities are our biggest priorities. The recent spike in numbers has caused us to implement additional safety precautions to help slow the spread of COVID-19," said Mary Thaut, JCCHS administrator. "We understand that wearing a face covering is not the most comfortable, but this is a necessary step to help keep our communities safe.

"We also understand the importance to our economy by keeping local businesses open. We want our community members to continue staying active. Requiring face coverings temporarily is an additional tool that each person can use to help protect each other. However, this should not replace other precautions such as social distancing."

The need for face coverings is based on the percentage of those who are unaware they have COVID-19.

Research shows that 25 to 80 percent of individuals are asymptomatic. They do not know they are carrying the active virus. This allows the coronavirus to spread more rapidly, making it more important to wear a face covering to protect those around them.

Exceptions to wearing face covering include:

- Those who are deaf or hard of hearing;
- Children younger than five years old and;
- Children who are younger than two years old should never wear face coverings due to the risk of suffocations.
- Children who are two, three, and four years old, with the assistance and close supervision of an adult, are strongly recommended to wear a face covering at all times in settings where it is likely that a distance of at least six feet cannot be maintained from non-household members and where the vulnerable population may be present.
- Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering. This includes, but is not limited to persons with a medical condition in which wearing a face covering could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance.
- Individuals seating in a restaurant or bar actively engaged in consuming food or drink, but only when adequately distanced from others.

How to properly wear a face covering

- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face
- · Make sure you can breathe easily
- When removing, untie the strings behind your head or stretch the ear loops
- Handle only by the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine (learn more about how to wash cloth face coverings)
- Be careful not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth when removing and wash hands immediately after removing.



CARES Funding Information



Johnson County is accepting applications for the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES) Funding. Local Government Agencies, Non-Profit entities and Small Businesses are eligible to apply for CARES Funds for expenses used for action taken to respond to the public health emergency. Please see the news release and the most recent guidance provided by the Missouri Treasurer's office as a reference for determining recipient qualification. Entities wishing to apply for CARES Funds will use the Application Form coming at a later date.

The following time line has been established for the first round of funding awards (\$2,000,000 cap in first round): June 1st - Applications are made available to entities June 19th - Applications for reimbursement of expenses incurred from March 1st to May 31st, 2020 with supporting documentation are due July 10th - Notification to applicant of the award decision will occur on or before this date

Additional rounds of funding will be made available after July 10th, with more information on those opportunities to follow.





Johnson County Collector's office receives 'excellent' rating following state audit

WARRENSBURG — The Missouri State Auditor's Office gave the Johnson County Collector's Office an "excellent" rating Monday, June 22, following an audit of the organization.

The county collector bills and collects property taxes for the county and most local governments.

Missouri law required an audit of the Johnson County Collector's Office is after a vacancy occurs in the office. Ruthane Small served as county collector until her resignation effective March 2, 2020.

Laura Smith was appointed the Johnson County collector and sworn into office March 3, 2020.

The Missouri State Auditor's Office's report stated the objective of the audit was to evaluate the county's internal controls over significant property tax functions and evaluate the county's compliance with certain legal pro-

Small said the Johnson County Collector's Office receives an in-house audit and external audit performed by the county each year, so the office only receives a state audit in the instance of a vacancy.

Small said the annual county audits ensure financial soundness and accuracy while the state audit also looks into different laws that are applied and makes sure computation is done in the correct manner.

"This job does not just involve taking the taxes over the counter and writing some checks at the end of the month," Small said.

Small said all of the payments made through the collector's office have different guidelines regarding how they are accepted and dispersed, which the auditor's office also looks at.

- 4. Do I enjoy the pleasant surprise of discovering I'm mistaken?






