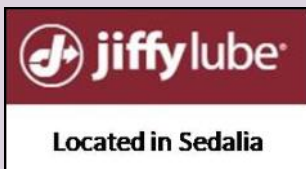

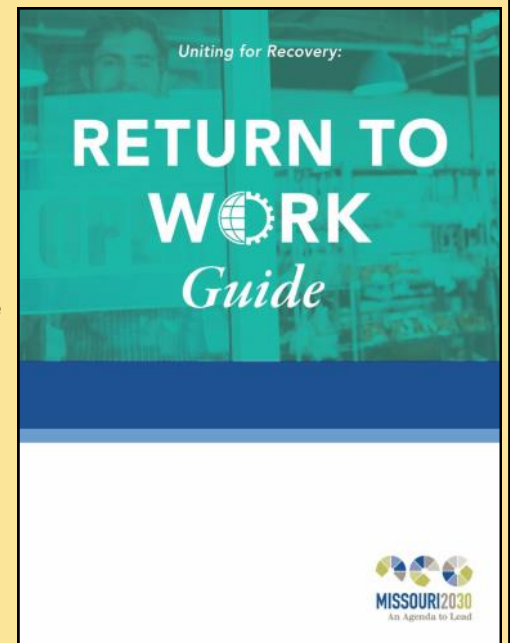

COVID-19 TESTING SERVICES

GETTING YOU BACK TO WORK

Drug Free Sport International (DFSI) is the premier provider of drug-use prevention services for athletic organizations, providing anti-doping solutions for the elite amateur and professional sports organizations across the country. With the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, DFSI is offering client services related to COVID-19 testing as an essential element in business plans to get employees back to work. DFSI partners with accredited laboratories that provide the latest testing technologies, including dried blood analysis for the three COVID antibodies and saliva testing for the active virus. DFSI also provides testing kits and specializes in coordinating sample collections on site. As an expert in third-party testing administration with a national collection network, DFSI is prepared to meet your COVID-19 testing needs.

TESTING OPTIONS

COVID-19 Antibody Test
A lab-developed dried blood spot (DBS) finger stick test for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that is administered by DFSI collection personnel or your own staff and shipped to the lab for analysis. The lab analysis can identify all three antibodies (IgA, IgM and IgG). The DBS results will note the presence, or lack of, COVID-19 antibodies in the individual.

COVID-19 Viral Test
Saliva tests for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that detect three gene transcripts specific to the COVID-19 virus. Presence of the virus is detectable within two days of infection and up to 28 days after infection. All samples are processed by an accredited laboratory.

FOUR STEPS TO RESULTS



Drug Free Sport International encourages everyday preventive measures to help limit the spread of COVID-19. We have made modifications to all our collection processes, including the use of PPE where appropriate. Additionally, we recommend Sample Collection Personnel follow public health and safety guidance provided by local authorities, the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

CDC has produced a series of factsheets for young adults, ages 15-21. The factsheets cover a variety of topics, including what test results mean, how to stay safe at the pool or beach, how to wear a face covering and other preventive measures.

JOHNSON COUNTY ANNOUNCES APPLICATION DATES FOR ROUND 2 OF CARES FUNDING:

Johnson County is making a second round of applications available to request CARES Act funds. In this second round of funding, local governments, non-profits, and small businesses will be eligible to submit an application. Two types of applications, related to necessary expenditures in response to the COVID-19 health emergency, will be accepted:

Reimbursement only, for the period of March 1, 2020 through August 31, 2020; and
Preapproval of planned projects, with a completion date no later than December 30, 2020.

Face Covering Order Extended

WARRENSBURG, Mo. (Aug. 17, 2020) - The Johnson County Community Health Services Board of Trustees voted unanimously during a special board meeting to extend the face covering order for Johnson County through 11:59 PM on Sunday night, Sept. 13, 2020. The goal is to sustain the reduction of positive COVID-19 cases.

"As the local public health agency, we must continue to work toward maintaining the health and wellness of our community. This includes taking steps to lower the risk of exposure to COVID-19, and lessen the probability for uncontrolled community spread," said Mary Thaut, JCCHS administrator. "We know the continued use of face coverings in public spaces in addition to other precautions, such as social distancing, will mitigate the risk. We have seen a significant reduction of positive cases since the order was first implemented on July 6." Since implementing the face covering order, Johnson County has seen a 73.9 percent decline in new cases in the first two weeks of August compared to the first two weeks in July. From July 1 to July 14, Johnson County had 199 confirmed positive cases. From August 1 through August 14, Johnson County had 52 confirmed positive cases. JCCHS extended the order to maintain the downward trend.

In addition, schools are reopening. It is important to take a proactive step toward helping contain the spread while students head back to the classroom. The use of face coverings will limit exposure to COVID-19.

School districts can implement alternative safety precautions for students when wearing face coverings in the classroom is not a viable option. This includes providing social distancing, and encouraging frequent hand washing.

While attending school in a classroom setting and/or while participating in school sponsored activities, students will fall under the school facility's current COVID-19 policy. Visitors and parents/guardians will continue to fall under the current county public health order.

Best practice recommendations state that individuals should wear face coverings in public settings when around people outside of their household, especially when social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

Face coverings help prevent individuals who have COVID-19 from spreading the virus to others, and are most likely to reduce the spread of COVID-19 when they are widely used by individuals in public settings. A face covering should not replace social distancing, but used as an additional layer of protection.

Wearing face coverings help slow the spread of COVID-19. It will take the help of every person within Johnson County to make this work.

Missouri Department of Economic Development announces up to \$30 million in grant funds for small businesses

The Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED) announced a new Small Business Grant Program that could provide up to \$30 million for Missouri small businesses. It was designed to provide relief to small businesses and family-owned farms for reimbursement of costs of business interruption caused by required closures due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

"This virus isn't going away, and we have to protect both the lives and the livelihoods of Missouri workers, families and children," Department of Economic Development Director Rob Dixon said. "Thanks to today's action by the Governor we are not only reinvesting in our economy, but building up the success and safety of our state over the long term."

This program also factors in \$7.5 million for family-owned farms and family farm corporations. Those participating in the production of agricultural crops, livestock or livestock products, poultry or poultry products, dairy products, or horticulture products are eligible for this grant.

"We know that every segment of agriculture has felt the tremendous impact of COVID-19 and will for many years," Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn said. "We have continuously worked with Governor Parson and my colleagues across state government -- including DED and the General Assembly -- to provide support for the unmet needs of Missouri's family-owned farms and ranches."

Organizations eligible for this grant employ 50 or fewer employees, including the owner(s). Grant amounts are initially limited to \$50,000, and organizations applying must incur or have incurred costs due to COVID-19 between March 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020. Applications will consider industry, timely use of funds, and availability of funds.

DED will begin accepting applications for this grant on July 15, 2020. The department is focused on assisting the hardest hit industries including retail trade, accommodation, food service, and health care, in addition to family-owned farms. However, this grant is not limited to these industries.

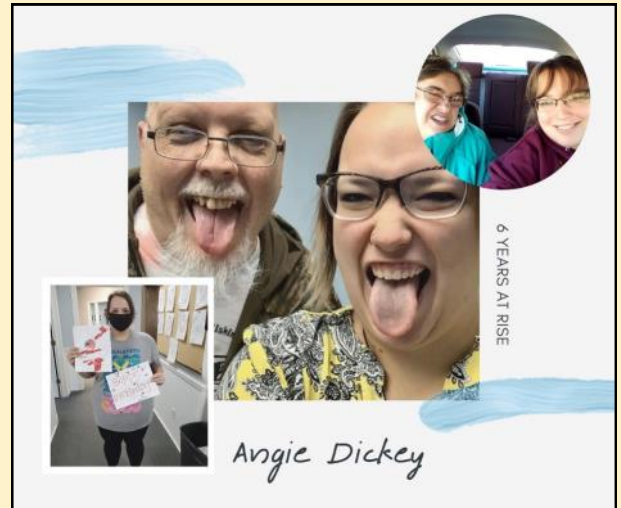

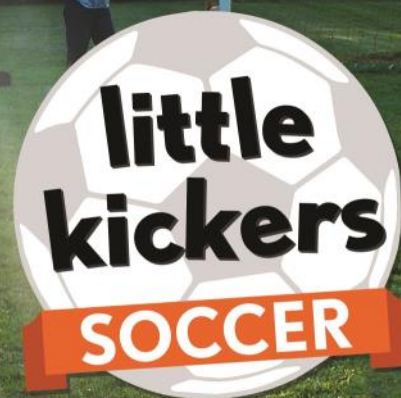

Tip: How to involve senior leaders in your online meetings.



TIP: Easy app to strengthen employees' ties with each other.

We really like this [1:30 minute video](#) from Debra Fine. She says that while two people may work together and know what jobs each do at the company, they don't really know each other. Her solution is by adding personal information it becomes more than **Person = Job**. She says, "When you become three-dimensional I begin to care about you."

With the isolation of working remotely and with many companies reaching across cities and countries, how do we become more than a collection of two-dimensional cogs? The garden-variety employee profiles in company directories don't help. That's where apps like [Rimeto](#) come in—"When people can find and understand each other, they can effectively work together." By providing richer information on work colleagues you see the other person as more than the role they perform. For example, it helps when you understand people's affiliations or areas of expertise, learn about their interests, education and even the kudos they've received.

Do a quick scroll down [Rimeto's home page](#) and you'll get an idea of how members of your team can go from being a name in a company directory to a three-dimensional person.

TIP: An inventive way to build your strategic network.

[Dorie Clark](#) and [Alisa Cohn](#) offer tips on "[How to Network When There Are No Networking Events](#)" (HBR June 23, 2020) and we particularly love this idea: "Invite senior leaders to your online working group meetings."

Clark and Cohn remind us that "the current crisis has raised a host of new issues" for most organizations and suggest taking the initiative and establishing an informal working group of colleagues to discuss these topics. They then explain how to get senior leadership involved:

"After gathering a group of peers a few times and establishing that the conversations are valuable, you can, where appropriate in your corporate culture, reach out to senior leaders and invite them to join a session, as either a participant or a guest speaker. A drop-by from a high-level leader may have been difficult, if not impossible, under normal circumstances — but with everyone working virtually (and the leader not traveling), a 15-minute appearance is often surprisingly easy to facilitate."

Here is co-author Alisa's experience: "In the early days of the pandemic, she took the initiative to convene a regular call with her peers in other geographies. As the crisis has played out, she has invited multiple company leaders, including the global CEO, to take part. That got her onto his radar, and he now calls her personally to discuss how the various regions are doing."

In times of crisis and economic instability, child abuse and neglect rates increase. However, reports of child abuse and neglect in Missouri have declined dramatically.

Children are not going to school, activities, places of worship and other public places where adults look out for their safety and well-being.

Trust your Gut

If something does not look safe, sound safe or feel safe - report.

Making a Report is Asking for Help and Services

When you report, you are asking for a professional to help a child and their family. You do not need proof. You are not making an accusation.

You May Be the Only Person to Act If you are reasonably suspect a child is unsafe - report.

Anonymous reports are accepted from anyone. Anyone making a report in good faith is protected against civil/criminal penalty or adverse employment action. Your identity is held confidential and will not be revealed.
