Meyer's Market—Warrensburg

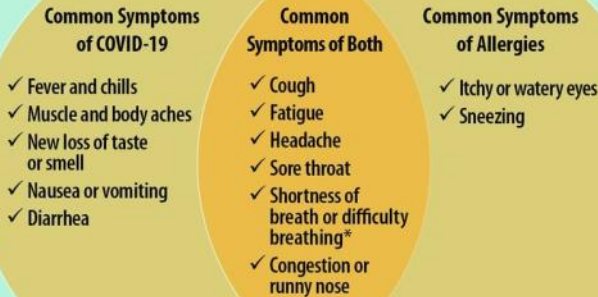

Public Health Advisory

The novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is considered an infectious, highly contagious communicable and dangerous disease, declared on March 11, 2020 to be a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization; and

On March 13 the President of the United States, Donald Trump, declared the outbreak of COVID-19 in the United States constitutes a national emergency and Governor of the State of Missouri declared a state emergency within the State of Missouri; and

The Center for Disease Control ("CDC") continues to study the spread and effects of COVID-19 across the United States and has determined that a significant portion of individuals with coronavirus lack symptoms and that even those who eventually develop symptoms can transmit the virus to others before showing symptoms, which means that the virus can spread between people interacting in close proximity (for example, speaking, coughing, or sneezing), even if those people are not exhibiting symptoms.

The Johnson County Public Health Officer and the Johnson County Community Health Services Board of Trustees issues the following county-wide Public Health Advisory: In accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services, individuals within Johnson County, Missouri are strongly cautioned to wear a face covering when in a public setting/transit

(including but not limited to grocery stores, pharmacies, businesses/organizations, place of worship, gym, community centers, libraries, schools, taxis, buses) and when around others who do not live in same household, and when social distancing measures are difficult to maintain. Individuals with a medical condition, mental health condition, disability that prevents them from wearing a mask should avoid public places as much as possible. Face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

Parties and social gatherings involving those outside the immediate household should be avoided. If an individual must be in public or private settings involving such gatherings, the use of face coverings are strongly encouraged in conjunction with other precautionary measures to include maintaining 6 feet of distance from other individuals, using proper cough/sneeze etiquette, disinfecting

frequently touched surfaces regularly, and frequent hand-washing/sanitizing.

Businesses, organizations, and other facilities (including but not limited to grocery stores, pharmacies, businesses/organizations, place of worship, gym, community centers, libraries, schools) where the public are entering, and social distancing cannot be maintained, may develop and implement additional precautionary measures (i.e. requiring face coverings for entry, requiring employees to wear face coverings during scheduled work hours, requiring face coverings within a classroom/conference setting, etc.) to protect those within their facility.

TESTING OPTIONS

COVID-19 Antibody Test

A lab-developed dried blood spot (DBS) finger stick test for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that is administered by DFSI collection personnel or your own staff and shipped to the lab for analysis. The lab analysis can identify all three antibodies (IgA, IgM and IgG). The DBS results will note the presence, or lack of, COVID-19 antibodies in the individual.

COVID-19 Viral Test

Saliva tests for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that detect three gene transcripts specific to the COVID-19 virus. Presence of the virus is detectable within two days of infection and up to 28 days after infection.

All samples are processed by an accredited laboratory.

FOUR STEPS TO RESULTS

1

DFSI receives client testing details.

2

DFSI provides collection kits and performs collection.

3

Sample collection personnel collect and ship samples to the laboratory.

Results report to client.

Western Missouri Medical Center is committed to providing our community with the latest information related to COVID-19. Part of that commitment includes our healthcare professionals providing you with the appropriate information when you have been exposed to COVID-19 and have questions related to exposure, testing, and our suggested guidelines of what to do next. All information on this flyer has been created in coordination with information published by the Center for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC). Due to the fact that the CDC does change their guidelines periodically, please check the CDC website regularly for updates.

Exposure

- What is exposure?
 - People who have been in close contact (within six feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a period of 15 minutes or more) with someone who has COVID-19.
 - Close contact can also include providing care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
 - Direct physical contact with the person (hugged or kissed them)
 - Sharing eating or drinking utensils
 - Sneezed, coughed, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you
- If you have a known exposure to a positive COVID-19 person, CDC guidelines recommend the following:
 - Self-isolate immediately, staying home for fourteen (14) days after your last contact with the person who has COVID-19
 - Watch for fever (100.4F), cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19
 - Contact your primary care provider's office, or Western Missouri Medical Center's COVID-19 Call Center at (660) 262-7580
- It is recommended that you should not be tested any earlier than five (5) days post your last known exposure to the positive person who has COVID-19, unless you develop symptoms

Testing

- You must have a provider order to be able to have COVID-19 test
- Symptomatic Patients needing to be tested:
 - If you are experiencing any symptoms related to COVID-19, such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, etc, please contact your primary care provider's office immediately for testing.
 - If you do not have a primary care provider, please contact our Express Care Clinic to speak with a provider. 660-262-7580, Option #2.
- Asymptomatic Patients needing to be tested:
 - If you do not develop any symptoms related to COVID-19 after having been exposed to a known positive case, please wait five (5) days post your last known exposure before being tested.

- If you have an established primary care provider, please contact their office and request that a COVID-19 order be placed in our system.
- If you do not have a primary care provider, please contact Western Missouri Medical Center's COVID-19 Call Center at 660-262-7580, Option #1 for further guidance on testing.
- After you have been tested for COVID-19, please allow 3-5 business days for results to come back. You will be notified once results are received.

Suggested Guidelines

- Maintain six (6) feet distance when it is available. Social distancing can help reduce the spread of COVID-19. In addition to wearing masks, avoid touching your face with unwashed hands, and frequently wash your hands with soap and water for at least twenty (20) seconds.
- Please wait five (5) full days post your last known exposure prior to being tested if you continue to be asymptomatic.
- Patients may have low levels of the virus in their bodies for up to three (3) months after diagnosis. This means that if the person who has recovered from COVID-19 is retested within three (3) months of initial infection, they may continue to have a positive test result, even though they are not spreading COVID-19.
 - For persons previously diagnosed with symptomatic COVID-19 who remain asymptomatic, the CDC does not recommend retesting within three (3) months after the date of symptom onset for the initial COVID-19 infection.
 - For persons who develop new symptoms consistent with COVID-19 during the three (3) months after the date of initial symptom onset, if an alternative etiology cannot be identified by a provider, the CDC recommends that the person may warrant retesting.
- For most persons with COVID-19, isolation and precautions can generally be discontinued ten (10) days after symptom onset and with resolution of fever for at least twenty-four (24) hours without the use of fever-reducing medications, and with improvement of symptoms.
- For persons who never develop symptoms, isolation and other precautions can be discontinued ten (10) days after the date of their first positive COVID-19 test.

TIP: Is your work-from-home space still noisy and crowded?

Perhaps the kids aren't going back to school or you haven't trained your dog to not bark when you are on a call. If that's the case, [Krisp](#), a noise-cancelling app might be the answer to your prayers! Their AI software recognizes the difference between human voices and background noise so that it can easily filter out distractions.

To test it for yourself, scroll down [their website](#) to the "See Krisp in Action" video section and select one of the accompanying background noises (e.g. barking dog, screaming children, coffee machine). Then during the video hit the Krisp demo button and see what happens. It is effective!

There is a free version that gives you 120 minutes/week of noise reduction, but perhaps the Pro or Team plan would be something your organization might want to consider.

TIP: A great way to stop mispronouncing people's names.

If you have a name that people often mispronounce, LinkedIn is here to help. A new feature allows you to record a 10-second audio clip of your name for others to hear.

As explained by Joseph Akoni, Product Manager at LinkedIn, "once you add a recording, other members visiting your profile can quickly listen to the recording to better understand your pronunciation preference and, subsequently, ensure they can correctly say your name. You can also listen to other members' pronunciations by visiting their profiles when they have added a recording."

Your pronunciation may not be obvious to everyone. For example, is Gayle's last name Hall-green or Hall-grin?

 If you are reasonably suspect a child is unsafe - report.
 Anonymous reports are accepted from anyone. Anyone making a report in good faith is protected against civil/criminal penalty or adverse employment action. Your identity is held confidential and will not be revealed.

- Next to an upcoming holiday, click **Confirm hours**. Or to choose a different date, click **Add new date**.
- Enter the opening and closing times for that day.
- To mark the location as closed all day, slide the circle to "Closed."
- If you're open 24 hours, click **Opens at**, and from the drop down menu select **24 hours**.
- If you enter closing hours past midnight, make sure to set them properly.

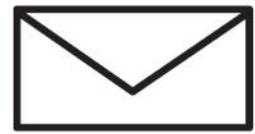

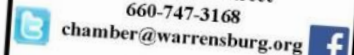
