Congrats to the Tough As Nails Champion, UCM's own Kelly "Murph" Murphy!



Missouri Marine veteran makes it to 'Tough As Nails' season finale

Two Missourians are on the first season of the CBS television show Tough As Nails. U.S. Marine Corps veteran Kelly Murphy of west-central Missouri's Warrensburg and St. Louis roofer Lee Marshall are on the show that has allowed them to earn cash by using their bare hands. The show, centering around blue collar challenges, is an inspiring display of strength, precision, team building skills, grit, determination and mental toughness.

Other skilled men and woman on the show include a welder, drywaller, scaffolder, flight gate agent, firefighters, farmer and deputy sheriff jailer. The challenges are also about strategy and working smarter not harder at real world job sites. Participants have worked to build a farm fence, railroad track, lay bricks, pull a caboose, shovel coal, set up an irrigation system in a farm field, among other things.

Murphy, otherwise known as Murph, became a cast member after catching the attention of someone from the Discovery

Channel. The individual saw videos on Murphy's Instagram account showcasing his different physical fitness activities and reached out about one year ago to encourage Murphy to apply for the show. Murphy thought it was a joke at first but soon after found out that it was the real deal.

"It's not very often you get an opportunity to do something like this and I never want to go through life passing up an opportunity," he says. "You only get so many checks in the box of life and I didn't want to pass this one up."

Murphy, 48, served 22 years as a Marine. He stands about 6'4 tall and towers over many of the other competitors. He has led soldiers on deployments with three members to as many as 210. He has been deployed to the Persian Gulf, Australia and southeastern Asia.

The military is made up of many blue collar jobs, which Murphy says members jokingly call "green collar" jobs. He held a variety of positions throughout his career, including in avionics, as an instructor and later a recruiter, in infantry, military police and motor transport.

Murphy was stationed at Fort Leonard Wood in southern Missouri in 2010. He retired about eight years ago to watch his four kids grow up. He is now the Director of the Military and Veterans Center at the University of Central Missouri in Warrensburg. The center is a one stop shop for veterans and their family members going to UCM. Murphy is sometimes seen on the show sporting a UCM t-shirt.

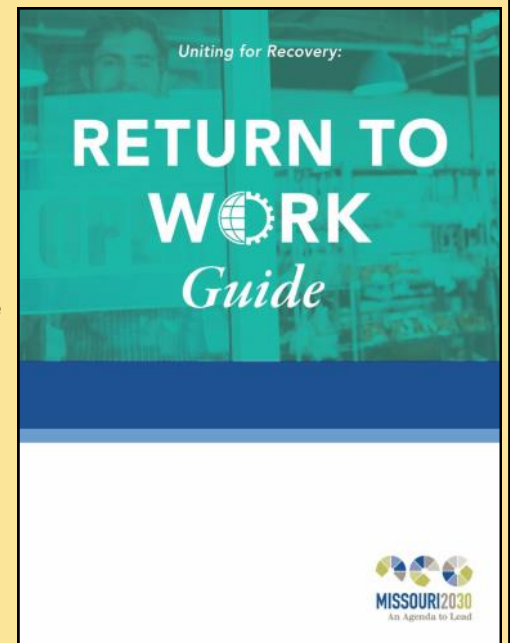

GETTING YOU BACK TO WORK

TESTING OPTIONS

COVID-19 Antibody Test
A lab-developed dried blood spot (DBS) finger stick test for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that is administered by DFSI collection personnel or your own staff and shipped to the lab for analysis. The lab analysis can identify all three antibodies (IgA, IgM and IgG). The DBS results will note the presence, or lack of, COVID-19 antibodies in the individual.

COVID-19 Viral Test
Saliva tests for asymptomatic or symptomatic populations that detect three gene transcripts specific to the COVID-19 virus. Presence of the virus is detectable within two days of infection and up to 28 days after infection.

All samples are processed by an accredited laboratory.

Drug Free Sport International encourages everyday preventive measures to help limit the spread of COVID-19. We have made modifications to all our collection processes, including the use of PPE where appropriate. Additionally, we recommend Sample Collection Personnel follow public health and safety guidance provided by local authorities, the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

CDC has produced a series of factsheets for young adults, ages 15-21. The factsheets cover a variety of topics, including what test results mean, how to stay safe at the pool or beach, how to wear a face covering and other preventive measures.

CARES Act Fund APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR ROUND 2 OF JOHNSON COUNTY CARES FUNDING

(Johnson County, MO) Johnson County is **now accepting applications** for the second round of CARES Act funds. In this second round of funding, local governments, non-profits, and small businesses are eligible to submit an application. Two types of applications, related to necessary expenditures in response to the COVID-19 health emergency, are being accepted:

Reimbursement only, for the period of March 1, 2020 through August 31, 2020; and Preapproval of planned projects, with a completion date no later than December 30, 2020.

Face Covering Order Extended

WARRENSBURG, Mo. (Aug. 17, 2020) - The Johnson County Community Health Services Board of Trustees voted unanimously during a special board meeting to **extend the face covering order for Johnson County through 11:59 PM on Sunday night, Sept. 13, 2020**. The goal is to sustain the reduction of positive COVID-19 cases.

"As the local public health agency, we must continue to work toward maintaining the health and wellness of our community. This includes taking steps to lower the risk of exposure to COVID-19, and lessen the probability for uncontrolled community spread," said Mary Thaut, JCCHS administrator. "We know the continued use of face coverings in public spaces in addition to other precautions, such as social distancing, will mitigate the risk. We have seen a significant reduction of positive cases since the order was first implemented on July 6." Since implementing the face covering order, Johnson County has seen a 73.9 percent decline in new cases in the first two weeks of August compared to the first two weeks in July. From July 1 to July 14, Johnson County had 199 confirmed positive cases. From August 1 through August 14, Johnson County had 52 confirmed positive cases. JCCHS extended the order to maintain the downward trend. In addition, schools are reopening. It is important to take a proactive step toward helping contain the spread while students head back to the classroom. The use of face coverings will limit exposure to COVID-19.

School districts can implement alternative safety precautions for students when wearing face coverings in the classroom is not a viable option. This includes providing social distancing, and encouraging frequent hand washing.

While attending school in a classroom setting and/or while participating in school sponsored activities, students will fall under the school facility's current COVID-19 policy. Visitors and parents/guardians will continue to fall under the current county public health order.

Best practice recommendations state that individuals should wear face coverings in public settings when around people outside of their household, especially when social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

Face coverings help prevent individuals who have COVID-19 from spreading the virus to others, and are most likely to reduce the spread of COVID-19 when they are widely used by individuals in public settings. A face covering should not replace social distancing, but used as an additional layer of protection.

Wearing face coverings help slow the spread of COVID-19. It will take the help of every person within Johnson County to make this work.

Missouri Department of Economic Development announces up to \$30 million in grant funds for small businesses

The Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED) announced a new Small Business Grant Program that could provide up to \$30 million for Missouri small businesses. It was designed to provide relief to small businesses and family-owned farms for reimbursement of costs of business interruption caused by required closures due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

"This virus isn't going away, and we have to protect both the lives and the livelihoods of Missouri workers, families and children,"

Department of Economic Development Director Rob Dixon said.

"Thanks to today's action by the Governor we are not only reinvesting in our economy, but building up the success and safety of our state over the long term."

This program also factors in \$7.5 million for family-owned farms and family farm corporations. Those participating in the production of agricultural crops, livestock or livestock products, poultry or poultry products, dairy products, or horticulture products are eligible for this grant.

"We know that every segment of agriculture has felt the tremendous impact of COVID-19 and will for many years," Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn said. "We have continuously worked with Governor Parson and my colleagues across state government -- including DED and the General Assembly -- to provide support for the unmet needs of Missouri's family-owned farms and ranches."

Organizations eligible for this grant employ 50 or fewer employees, including the owner(s). Grant amounts are initially limited to \$50,000, and organizations applying must incur or have incurred costs due to COVID-19 between March 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020. Applications will consider industry, timely use of funds, and availability of funds.

DED will begin accepting applications for this grant on July 15, 2020. The department is focused on assisting the hardest hit industries including retail trade, accommodation, food service, and health care, in addition to family-owned farms. However, this grant is not limited to these industries.

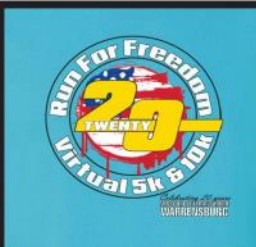

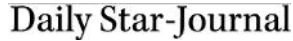

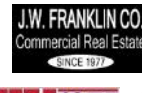

Remote Workers Are Getting Hit By Ransomware

According to the 2020 Vulnerability and Treat Trends Report, the number of new samples of ransomware increased by a staggering 72 percent during the first half of this year. Hackers around the world have come to increasingly view it as their go-to attack option.

As with a great many things in recent months, this trend can be traced back to the COVID-19 pandemic. In response to the virus, untold millions of employees began working from home, which allowed them to stay productive, but at a terrible cost to network security. Few companies can afford to provide the same level of security and protection to their remote employees as they can when everyone is in the office.

While that certainly doesn't provide bullet-proof protection, that kind of visibility goes a long way toward minimizing your risk. If you don't have something very like that in place right now, you need it as soon as possible.

In times of crisis and economic instability, child abuse and neglect rates increase. However, reports of child abuse and neglect in Missouri have declined dramatically.

Children are not going to school, activities, places of worship and other public places where adults look out for their safety and well-being.

Trust your Gut

If something does not look safe, sound safe or feel safe - report.

Making a Report is Asking for Help and Services

When you report, you are asking for a professional to help a child and their family. You do not need proof. You are not making an accusation.

You May Be the Only Person to Act
If you are reasonably suspect a child is unsafe - report.

Anonymous reports are accepted from anyone. Anyone making a report in good faith is protected against civil/criminal penalty or adverse employment action. Your identity is held confidential and will not be revealed.

To set hours, follow these steps:

Set 24-hour business hours

Next to each day of the week that your business is open, click Opens at 24 hours.

Set special hours

On your computer, sign in to Google My Business.

- If you have multiple locations, open the location you'd like to manage.
- Click Info > **Special hours**. (You'll only find this section if you've already provided regular hours.)
- Next to an upcoming holiday, click **Confirm hours**. Or to choose a different date, click **Add new date**.
- Enter the opening and closing times for that day.
- To mark the location as closed all day, slide the circle to "Closed."
- If you're open 24 hours, click **Opens at**, and from the drop down menu select **24 hours**.
- If you enter closing hours past midnight, make sure to set them properly.
- When you've finished entering all of your special hours, click **Apply**. Your special hours will appear to customers on Google only for the designated days.

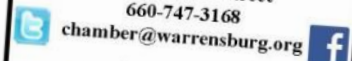
