

#### Warrensburg Chamber welcomes Behavioral Health Holdings to county

KNOB NOSTER—The Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce hosted a ribbon cutting for Behavioral Health Holding's new Early Intervention Clinic on Friday, Jan. 29.

The new clinic is located at 945 NE 105th Road, Knob Noster. BHH provides services to individuals with developmental disabilities.

Director of Business Development Mia Gonzalez said BHH assists individuals of all ages with developmental disabilities, but the Early Intervention Clinic specializes in assisting with children diagnosed with autism.

Gonzalez said the clinic provides intensive services for children to learn more skills, decrease challenging behaviors and prepare them for school.

Gonzalez added that the BHH organization provides additional services such as a private day school for children with developmental disabilities as well as transportation, residential and crisis services. Prior to the opening of the Knob Noster clinic, Gonzalez said BHH had spoken with the Warrensburg Police Department to discuss the community's need for crisis services for individuals with severe behavioral challenges due to developmental disabilities.

Behavioral Health Holdings President Erin Wiercinski said when speaking with WPD Chief Rich Lockhart, he explained that when incidents arise involving individuals with developmental disabilities engaging in severe challenging behaviors, police are called to respond to the incident.

"Our mission within our organization is to modify these individuals' behaviors," Wiercinski said. "We utilize the science behind behavioral analysis to change their behavior instead of having to use police involvement, hospitalization and medications."

#### **Tuesday Talk with Quarry City Savings & Loan**





#### **Optimist Club of Warrensburg, Missouri**

Calling all teachers and youth!!!!!! Are you looking for a lesson plan, do you have a student who is interested in oratory and 'or essay writing? Each year, the Optimist International Foundation promotes both an essay and oratorical context, with the Optimist Club of Warensburg hosting our local oratorical on March 25 and we need participants. This would be a great educational block to help students prepare and present their views through the oratorical context or voice their thoughts through creative writing with the essay contest. This is also a great opportunity to earn scholarship SSSs as well as gain speaking experience.

Since its start in 1928, the Optimist Oratorical Contest has become the longest-running program sponsored by Optimist International. This year's oratorical topic" Healing The World With Optimism" is the theme with a very broad spectrum of interpretation. The contest is designed for youth to gain experience in public speaking and provide them with the opportunity to compete for a college scholarship. It is very easy to apply for the contest. Interested students should prepare a 4- to 5-minute speech on the assigned topic to present at the contest. The speeches are judged at the Club level, Regional level (if needed) and then at the District level. Our first and second place winners will go directly to Regionals' to compete for a \$500 award. District winners get scholarships of \$2500, \$1500 and \$1000.


Optimist International will also host an essay contest as well This years topic, "Reaching Your Dreams by Choosing Optimism" could be a great creative writing project for a class and would give students the chance to share their thoughts during this most interesting of times. The essay winner can win up to \$2500 at the district level, with the deadline for submissions for this contest being Feb 19.

Youth of all ages are encouraged to compete and gain experience and give their view on the topic. The contest is open to youth under the age of 19 as of October 1st of the current Optimist International contest year (October 1 – September 30) and is not enrolled as a degree seeking student of a post-secondary institution. There is no minimum age.

## **COVID-19 Related Content**



#### COVID-19 Vaccine in Johnson County

WARRENSBURG, Mo. (Dec. 15, 2020) – Johnson County Community Health Services (JCCHS) is currently working through plans on distribution and administering the COVID-19 vaccine. Phase 1-A for healthcare workers and long-term care facilities will begin soon.

The Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) allocated the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine to counties across the state. The vaccine was authorized for emergency use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration on Friday night, Dec. 11, 2020. The vaccine is a series of two doses administered three weeks apart.

The schedule for vaccine distribution according to the state is: Phase 1-A: Healthcare Workers and long-term care facilities. Phase 1-B: Emergency response and essential workers. Phase 2: Additional Phase-1 populations if not vaccinated in Phase 1, high risk populations and potentially all Missouri residents (as availability increases).

Phase 3: All Missouri residents – expected in spring or early summer and is dependent on vaccine availability.

JCCHS is working closely with local partners for storage and countywide distribution plans of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Below are common questions that are answered by the latest guidance issued by DHSS:

What do I do if I miss the second dose 21 days after the first dose? Patients who do not receive the second vaccination dose at 21 days should still receive that second dose as soon as possible thereafter.

Should you get the vaccine if you have already contracted COVID-19? Yes, but for both symptomatic and asymptomatic COVID-19 patients, you should defer vaccination until you have met criteria to discontinue isolation.

Can you receive the vaccine if you are pregnant?

Yes, pregnant females are recommended for the vaccine depending on the individual's risk of acquisition due to the level of community transmission, personal risk of contracting COVID-19 due to occupation or other activities, risks of COVID-19 to the mother and potential risks to the fetus, efficacy of the vaccine, known side effects of the vaccine and the lack of data about the vaccine during pregnancy. Special counseling and a 15-minute observation period after vaccination, if chosen, is recommended.

Women who are pregnant or breastfeeding are encouraged to discuss vaccination with their primary care physician or OB prior to receiving the vaccine. A physician's order could be required.

Should you have a pregnancy test or antibody test prior to receiving the vaccine?

Routine testing for pregnancy or antibody tests is not recommended in relation to vaccine use.

BIG TIRES

Can you get this vaccine if you are in quarantine due to an exposure with a positive COVID-19 case?

You should delay your vaccination if you have had a known SARS-CoV-2 (virus that causes COVID-19) exposure until your quarantine period has ended, unless residing in a congregate setting (health care/ long-term care facility, correctional facility, homeless shelter, etc.).

Can you get the flu shot and COVID-19 vaccine at the same time? There is no information on co-administration of this COVID-19 vaccine with other vaccines. The Pfizer vaccine should be spaced at least 14 days from any other vaccine.

If you have been vaccinated, can you stop from using other precautions?

While experts learn more about the protection that COVID-19 vaccines provide under real-life conditions, it will be important for everyone to continue using all the tools available to us to help stop this pandemic, like covering your mouth and nose with a mask, washing hands often, and staying at least 6 feet away from others. Together, COVID-19 vaccination and following CDC's recommendations for how to protect yourself and otherswill offer the best protection from getting and spreading COVID-19.

Who is not recommended for the Pfizer vaccine? Those under age 16.

An individual who has experienced a serious reaction (e.g., anaphylaxis) to a prior dose of a COVID-19 vaccine or to any of its components. For information on vaccine components, refer to the manufacturers' package insert.

This vaccine is free or low-cost. Doses provided by the federal government are provided to Missourians at no cost. However, vaccinators can charge an administration fee for giving someone the shot. A maximum fee amount has not been set at this time. Most insurance companies will cover an administration fee.

Most importantly, Missouri residents cannot be denied a vaccine if they cannot afford the administration fee or do not have insurance.

Most reported side effects were mild and include pain at the injection site, tiredness, headache, muscle pain, chills, joint pain, and fever. Of note, more people experienced these side effects after the second dose than after the first dose.

Please visit https://covidvaccine.mo.gov/ for more information. JCCHS continues to recommend following safety precautions as the county moves toward vaccine distribution completion. These include the 3Ws. Wear a mask, watch your distance and wash your hands.





Stop the snowball of consensus... from a world-class poker player.

#### TIP: Stop the snowball of consensus... from a world-class poker player.

Annie Duke, a poker player with a cognitive science background knows a thing or two about making decisions. She shares her thoughts in this strategy + business article, "Stop Trusting Your Gut". One decision-making area she discusses is group

discussions and the belief that people will tell you their point of view honestly. That's not always what happens.

As she explains: "Once consensus starts to form, it generates its own momentum. It's like a snowball that turns into an avalanche of consensus... as you hear everyone else in the room agree, you start to question your own beliefs." To complicate matters there's the challenge of our hybridnetworking world where remote meetings don't show body language or other in-person vibes to 'read the room'.

Avoid the snowball effect by asking for individual input before a team meeting. "The leader collates the answers into areas of agreement and areas where the responses diverged. Once the meeting starts, the leader can quickly move through the consensus and spend most of the time talking about the differences, which is where the good stuff comes up. That's the opposite of a typical meeting, where 80 percent of the time is spent talking about the consensus."



Tip: The10 top ways to be a better networker.

## TIP: Top 10 Ways to be a Positive Networker

- 1. All connections have value, so treat each interaction as worthy of your time (and theirs).
- 2. Start your smile on the way to meeting someone.
- 3. Be the first person to put out your hand. This also avoids "The Hug".
- 4. Give the person you are talking to 98% of your attention. Save 2% for those standing in your periphery.
- 5. Ask the first question.
- 6. If it's a challenge to get a conversation going, keep asking questions. We find that most people give up too soon.
- 7. Keep this thought in mind: Is there anything I can do for this person, can I add value?
- 8. If you say you are going to follow up, do it quickly. Response time expectations are shorter these days.
- Always have business cards, even if you choose other options to connect. It's doesn't have to be an either/ or strategy.
- 10. Act like a host, even if you aren't. Welcome people into your sphere. Rescue wallflowers and connect people who should meet one and other.
