WARRENSBURG — The Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce recently hosted ribbon cuttings to celebrate the opening of Soderburg Roofing & Contracting and the completed remodel of Best Western Inn of Warrensburg.



COVID-19 Vaccine in Johnson County


WARRENSBURG, Mo. (Dec. 15, 2020) - Johnson County Community Health Services (JCCHS) is currently working through plans on distribution and administering the COVID-19 vaccine. Phase 1-A for healthcare workers and long-term care facilities will begin soon.

The Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) allocated the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine to counties across the state. The vaccine was authorized for emergency use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration on Friday night, Dec. 11, 2020. The vaccine is a series of two doses administered three weeks apart.

Quarantine for Vaccinated Persons

Get 1st Dose

Get the first dose of your vaccine, Pfizer or Moderna. If you receive Johnson & Johnson, you can skip to Step 4.



Waiting Period The time between your first

and second dose of the Pfizer (21 days) or Moderna (28 days) vaccine.



Get the second dose of your Pfizer or Moderna vaccine the same brand as your first





STEP

Waiting Period

This is a two week period before the vaccine is considered fully effective.

Post-Vaccination

After the two week waiting period, you are not required to quarantine if exposed to a suspected or confirmed COVID-19 case, and do not develop symptoms during the 14 days after exposure.





Continue to wear a mask and practice good hand hygiene, and maintain social distance from those outside of your immediate household.

Guidance does not apply to inpatients or residents in a healthcare setting.

Tip: What's your organization's policy on the future of remote work?







TIP: What's your organization's policy on the future of remote work?

Recent research by McKinsey on the future of remote work has found that many organizations haven't communicated to their employees what their post pandemic work-world is going to look like:

- · 40 percent of them say they've yet to hear about any vision from their organizations
- · 28 percent say that what they've heard remains vague

McKinsey also says "that organizations that convey more detailed, remote-relevant policies and approaches see greater increases in well-being and productivity". How can you help your organization go from a vague plan to a detailed policy for hybrid-work?

- · Start by concentrating on policies that provide "clear hours for collaboration and expectations on when to be online, with flexibility outside those hours."
- Set guidelines for on-site employees to dial-in to remote meetings and have small team events to get people connecting.
- And don't forget to do "pulse surveys" from time to time that provide insight into what is and isn't working.

TIP: Why you should be sharing content on LinkedIn!

LinkedIn turns eighteen this year and it really has become the site for business professionals in this new hybrid-work and hybrid-networking™ world. In 2020 it saw a 55% increase in conversations among connections.

And content creation on LinkedIn increased 60%! Those are pretty impressive statistics. "Companies and individual LinkedIn members have ramped up their LinkedIn content to stay in touch with professional contacts and colleagues in this unprecedented year" according to a report compiled by Hootsuite.



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


